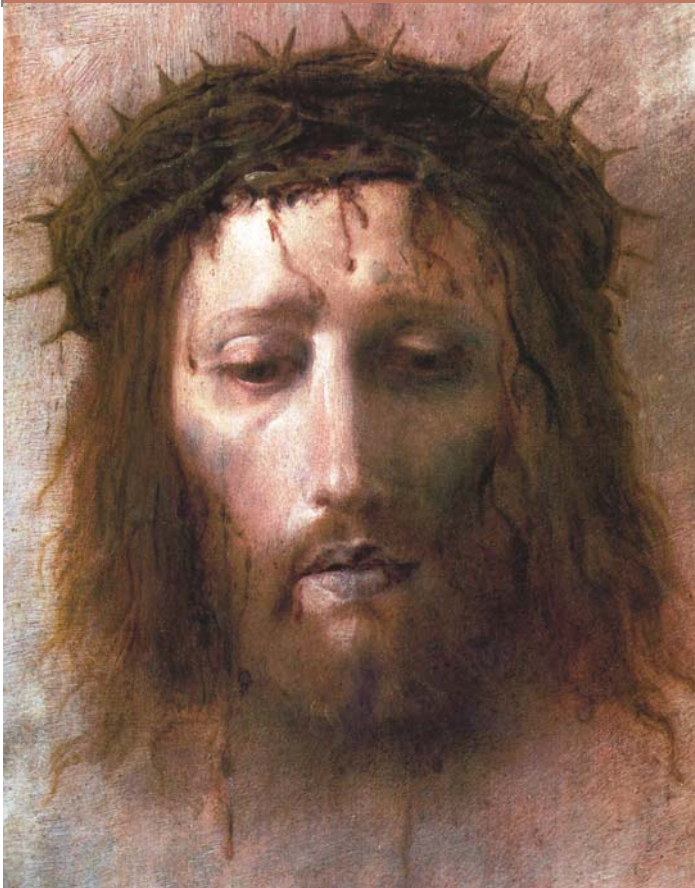

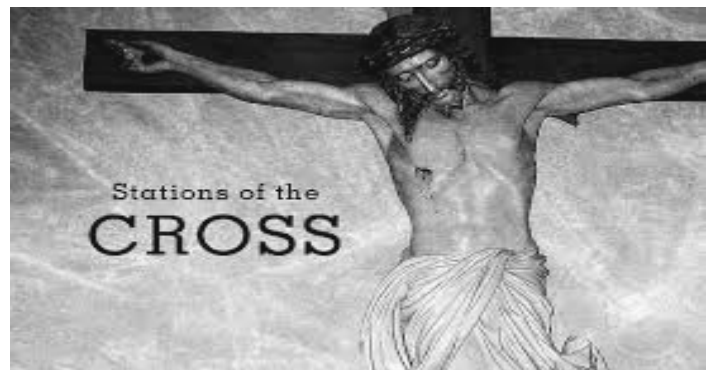

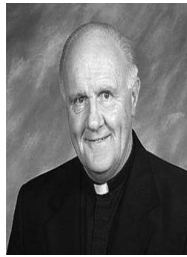
### **A WALK WITH CHRIST**

**We Believe in the Resurrection**

One of the most moving and powerful poems written by William B. Yeats was his "Easter 1916." Skeptical at first, Yeats had reluctantly come to recognize the transforming effect on Ireland of its "Easter Rebellion." Launched on Easter Monday, 1916 the timing no coincidence—by a "motley" crew of unlikely leaders, Yeats had come to appreciate "the Rising" as the rebirth of the Irish nation. His refrain throughout the poem is "all changed, changed utterly. A terrible beauty is born." I propose that Christians can say as much at every Easter time if we really believe as the Orthodox say each Easter, "Christ is risen; He is risen indeed."



Ah, but do we really believe it— this crowning event in the historical life of Jesus and God's ultimate seal upon Him as the Christ of our faith? For Easter is a lot to believe. That Jesus lived, died and then was raised on our behalf (Roman 4:25); that bonded Christ by Baptism, we too, are raised up and can "live in newness of life" (Rom 6:4). It's a lot to believe that "the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also" (2 Cor 4:14), that his resurrection has given us "the victory" over sin, that evil cannot finally triumph— why, even death has "lost its sting" (1 Cor 15:55-57). We know for sure that we will all die, but can we also trust that "in Christ, shall all be brought to life" again?

**Pastoral Changes in our Parish**

As was announced last weekend at all Masses, our parish will be experiencing some pastoral changes within the near future. While Msgr. McSweeney had announced his retirement from our parish in early February, we have only recently learned that our new pastor will be Msgr. Joseph Peterson who currently serves as the Vicar Forane of the Parkersburg Vicariate and pastor of St. Margaret Mary Parish in Parkersburg. Msgr. Peterson is a native son of West Virginia and has been a priest for 41 years. We will welcome our new pastor to the parish effective June 15.

In addition, it was also announced that Fr. Sebastian Devasya, our Associate Pastor, will be departing our parish in June as he has been appointed Administrator of two parishes in the Southern reaches of our state – Sacred Heart Parish in Princeton and Sacred Heart Parish in Bluefield. A new Associate Pastor will be named for our parish within the next several months.

It goes without saying that our parish is saddened to see the departure of Msgr. McSweeney and Fr. Sebastian. However, we have been blessed with their ministry in our parish and we offer them our gratitude and appreciation for all that they have done and we pray that God will bless them in their new endeavors.

For the 25th consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire this experience for their children but may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. For this reason, Bishop Michael J. Bransfield has allocated funds for distribution to Catholic families in need of financial assistance. Any Catholic student accepted for the 2016-2017 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru Grade 12) is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants. Online applications are now being accepted at [www.factsmgmt.com](http://www.factsmgmt.com). There is a \$25 application fee—the Diocese will pay \$12.50 and families pay the other \$12.50. The deadline to apply is April 30, 2016 with notifications of assistance going on in late May. ## CONFESSIONAL MODIFICATION



Our confessionals have been modified to have two lights above the door. In the two-color system, a green light above the priest's location shows that he is in the confessional and he is available for confession, whereas a red light above the penitent/s area/s shows that it is already occupied and that parishioners should keep away from it so as not to overhear something.
